But you can host a watch party and watch movies with friends online. These services make it easy. Separater and group watching features allow non-service subscribers to access subscription content. Everyone who joins one of these parties must have their own subscription to which service you use to participate. Netflix Party is the feature that started it all. Using Netflix in a web browser or on Chrome, Roku, or Apple TV, you can connect to up to 50 of your friends from anywhere Netflix is available. However, you and everyone who joins your party will need to install a Chrome extension to use Netflix Party. However, once installed, you can select a movie, click Netflix Party, adjust some features, and start sharing an invitation. Then you can start seeing your favorites with your friends, and you can chat about it right from the screen you're using. Caavo has a Watch With Friends mobile app that lets you have a Netflix Watch Party with unlimited attendees, and even with people using mobile devices To use Netflix Watch Party, find the content you want to share, click Watch Party, invite your friends, and then you're good at chatting and watching together. Amazon Prime took a clue from Netflix, and launched its own version of viewer-party features. But Amazon Prime Video Watch Party allows you to connect up to 100 of your friends, and you have access to all the movies and TV shows available through Amazon Prime. Unfortunately, you can't stream rental or new release titles or premium channels, but there's plenty to choose from in Prime. To start an Amazon Prime Video Watch Party, find the video you want to watch with the Watch Party icon. Click this, invite friends, and start watching and chatting with your friends. Hulu is one of the best streaming services available, and Hulu subscribers paying for the Hulu (No Ads) plan or Hulu (No Ads) + Live TV plan has access to this (apparently beta) feature of the streaming service. Users can host a Hulu Watch Party that lets them choose between movies with the Watch Party icon. Up to 8 people can join a Hulu Watch Party, including multiple users on the same account, and playback will be synced for all 8 people. There is also an option to chat as a group while the viewer party is in progress. To host a watch party on Hulu, find a title with the Watch Party icon and click on it, click Start watching, invite your friends and you're ready. Facebook Watch is not your typical Watch Party software or application. Instead, there is a feature on Facebook that allows you to see movies from Facebook, which users have uploaded, and from other sources. You can also see with friends using the Watch Party feature in Facebook Watch. The service has a lot to go for it: user-generated videos, it can be used on devices, and it's Facebook easy to use. But it also has some limitations. Users are restricted to the content they may share with others, and they cannot view content from external services. Still, if there are Facebook videos you and your friends like, this is a decent enough solution. To start a Facebook page, click in the What's in your mind as if you were writing a post. Then select the three-dot menu and select Watch Party. Now you can choose what you want to see and share it with your friends. Landscape is a Chrome browser extension that you can add that lets you create and share separts with up to 50 of your friends. The service works with Netflix, HBO, Vimeo, Prime Video, Hulu, Funimation and Disney+ (and adds others). However, the crown jewel of the Scenes product is the ability to have voice, video and text chatting along with which movie or show you choose to watch. Several guides The big players Sony Crackle, Crackle or Crackle Plus Once known as Crackle, this free streaming site has been through almost as many name changes as P. Diddy. Originally controlled by Sony, there is now a joint-venture between Sony and Chicken Soup for The Soul Entertainment (CSS). This partnership created a new device called Crackle Plus, and it was thought that this would also be the name of the streaming service as well. But a look at the site, and it's clear that simplicity has won: It's just called Crackle. Whatever you call it, the service includes content from six ad-supported CSS streaming services (Popcornflix, Popcornflix Kids, Popcornflix Comedy, Frightpix, Españolflix and Truli), as well as some Sony movies and TV shows. You'll find a good range of blockbusters like Speed, The Transporter and Close Encounters of the Third Kind, and a generous smattering of obscure but interesting B-movies. Crackle is a great resource, although the constant interruptions from advertisers can get old pretty quickly. The service is offered in 21 countries but has shut down its Canadian, Latin American and Australian offerings. IMDb TV Newer to this roundup is Amazon-owned IMDb TV (formerly known as Freedive). It has free, ad-supported TV shows and movies. In February 2020, the service acquired the rights to over 20 Disney-owned series, including Lost, Desperate Housewives, Malcolm in the Middle and My So-Called Life. It is also the only site that allows you to stream Lost and Malcolm in the middle for free. Other TV shows in its relatively small library include Fringe, Heroes, Quantum Leap and Forensic Files. Movies include Memento, La La Land, Drive, Monster, Donnie Darko, Dune, The Illusionist, Zodiac, Clue and more. You can watch IMDb TV online, Amazon Fire devices and Apple TV, and through the Amazon Prime app that you can find on many smart TVs, tablets and phones. IMDb TV is US-only for now, although a European expansion is in the works. Vudu Walmart-owned Vudu may be better known for its subscription streaming service, but the platform also has an impressive and free ad-supported content section. Titles like The Escort, 10,000 Days and The Offering are great examples of what you'll find. If you take a cruise through the site's range of 4K/HDR titles, there are even one or two free to see options. You still need a Vudu account, but you can create one for free. The Vudu app is already supported by many platforms, including Roku, Apple TV, game consoles and more. In addition, there is an app for most mobile devices. Vudu is only available in usa Hoopla How is this for a good deal: Sign up for a library card and get free downloads or streams of movies, with no ads at all. That's the deal when you use Hoopla, a digital media streaming platform that has partnered with local libraries to give members access to borrowable content online. It's similar to Overdrive, but with than just ebooks and audiobooks. The availability of a given title will depend on your location and the number of copies available for download, but we found some surprisingly decent flicks when we checked in August 2020. Streaming works on all devices with a web browser, while downloads require the Hoopla app on a mobile device. Not all libraries support Hoopla at the moment, so make sure you ask. So far, libraries in the United States and Canada have access to Hoopla. YouTube This is a no-brainer. Everyone knows that YouTube is the largest online video hosting service, and you're probably already using the site for stupid cat videos and footage of people being hit with fitness balls. But YouTube also has a significant collection of feature-length movies at its free level. Granted, most of these are B-list news, but there are some quality movies hiding in there. In addition to the free, Google-curated movies, there are thousands of movies on the site that don't appear unless you search directly for them. If you're looking for a specific title, especially an older one, it's worth performing a quick search on YouTube to see if anyone has posted it. These are not always uploaded by the film's rights holders, and many of them are divided into episodes and playlists, but as they say, beggars cannot be selected. Finding free movies on YouTube has become harder lately, as more rights holders choose to offer their movies for rent via the service, and YouTube also has subscription levels like YouTube Premium and the live TV streaming service YouTube TV. Nevertheless, you'll find a lot to look at, especially if your standards aren't too high in terms of the quality of the power. Roku devices certainly won't break the bank, but they're not free. Now, however, the Roku channel is available to everyone, online, as well as through the company's free apps for iOS and Android. The service has more than 10,000 titles to choose from, including old favorites such as Con Air, Boyz n the Hood, Must Love Dogs and the Police Academy. You must create a free account before you can watch, but it is a quick and painless process. If you ever decide to expand your choices, the Roku channel is now home to several premium subscription options, including Showtime, Epix and Starz. The Roku Channel is available in the United States and Canada. Plex Free Movies and TV Shows Plex is best known as a versatile and easy way to manage and watch your private collection of movies, music, photos and other media. But in 2019, the company launched its own ad-supported free streaming service with a collection of movies and TV shows from studios such as MGM, Warner, Lionsgate and Legendary. It is available globally, although the title selection will vary greatly from region to region. You can access the collection of movies and programs from a web browser, or on any large number of devices that support the Plex client software, such as Apple TV, Roku, smart TVs, etc. All you need is a free Plex account and you're ready to go. For those who already use Plex as a media server, the free ad-supported options can be added to existing server categories, making the experience completely seamless. Pluto TV Although it may not be as well known as the above services, Pluto TV is still worthy of your attention. Not only does it host free movies on demand, but there is also a free live TV streaming service, hosting content curated from all over the web. While the channels vary wildly, we are focused here on the movies. Pluto TV currently has several live movie channels, perfect if you want to see something but don't know what. There are two general movie channels, while the rest are focused on specific genres or categories, including action movies, Flicks of Fury, Horror 24/7, Classic Movies, Black Cinema, Gravitas Movies and The Asylum. The service works in the United States, as well as many international locations. Pluto TV's on-demand film library is relatively small and often rotates, but offers as much variety as its live movie channels. It's also available on lots of devices in addition to your computer, including Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Roku devices and more. To find out more about Pluto TV, see our full guide to the service. Tubi TV Another up-and-comer, Tubi is very similar to Sony Crackle, in that it offers both free movies and TV episodes. No matter what device you use, chances are pretty good that you'll be able to see Tubi, as it's available on Android, iOS, Roku, Apple TV, Amazon Fire TV, Samsung Smart TV, Sony Smart TV, PlayStation 4, Xbox One and the internet. As with the vast majority of services on this list, you need to see some commercials, but that's what keeps the service free. Tubi has content from over 200 partners, including NBCUniversal, which brings with it nearly 400 classic titles such as Xena: Warrior Princess, Hercules: The Legendary Journeys, The A-Team, Punky Brewster, and the original versions of Magnum, P.I., The Bio Womannic and Transformers. Cult Classics Like Assault on Precinct 13, Sleepaway and C.H.U.D., along with soon-to-be cult classics like 10 Cloverfield Lane and No Country for Old Men, can also be found in the growing catalog. If you use this service to supplement Netflix instead of replacing it, the Not on Netflix section will help you find new and interesting movies to watch. Independent and documentaries SnagFilms

Snagfilms is a video-on-demand website that has a selection of movies you can't find anywhere else online. Founded in 2008, around 10,000 independent documentaries and narrative films have been collected. There are many rare gems to see here, and since the founders have worked to establish dozens of partnerships, there are also many different streaming devices that support free SnagFilms. The service is currently available as a free app for iOS and Android, but it is also compatible with various Roku devices, Kindles and a variety of other streaming devices. The main site is also a breeze to navigate. Snagfilms are available internationally, but some titles are only available in the United States and Canada. Kanopy Just like Hoopla, Kanopy is not only free to use, but it is also commercially free if you have a library card. Originally founded in 2008 in Australia as an educational tool, Kanopy now offers a library of over 30,000 films through its partnerships with more than 200 libraries. There's a big focus on independent free movies and documentaries (the company even has access to many newer films from the A24 catalogue), but you'll find all sorts of movies available, and even more are on the way thanks to a deal that will see the entire catalog of filmmaker Fred Wiseman come to the service. Kanopy is available internationally, but content may vary from location to location. Top documentaries Love documentaries? So do we. You know what they're saying, the truth is stranger than fiction. The aptly titled Top Documentary Films is, hands down, the best place for documentaries. Not all choices are movie length, but a good documentary doesn't have to be long - some of the best are under the 60-minute mark. With a library of more than 3,000 movies, the site also has a simple and straightforward layout and categorizes all of its movies based on the subject, making it easy to find something you're interested in right away. The content does not host the site, but rather curated and embedded from other sites such as YouTube, Vimeo, Daily Motion, etc. It's available internationally, but not all content works in every location. Sources of classic movies Archive.org Chances are, you read this article because you are looking for a place to watch recently released movies online. Even if there's nothing wrong with that, you definitely shouldn't ignore all the amazing older movies the internet has to offer. Archive.org offers a veritable treasure trove of old movies you've probably never heard of, as well as a handful that you'll recognize. The archive - which is also home to the famous Wayback Machine which you how the internet used to be - have silent movies, black and white horror movies, obscure sci-fi movies and a selection of other movies. (If you're curious, there's a reference to the previous big five movie houses: 20th Century Fox, RKO Pictures, Paramount Pictures, Warner Bros., and Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer.) If your idea of a fun weekend is to kick back and watch Turner Classic Movies, you'll dig Big Five Glories. All films are considered public, so there is no restriction on availability. Retrovision Retrovision is another public website that features hundreds of classic films from several different eras. The word classic may be up for interpretation - there are some movies here that were made as recently as last year, and not all of Retrovision's movies are of high quality - but there are still a lot of good things here. Retrovision is also a well-designed website that allows users to filter based on genre. It is also not limited to feature films, as there is a robust collection of classic TV shows to choose from. Shocker Internet Drive-In Shocker Internet Drive-In is a bit niche, and the site looks like it was made in the 90s, but it's a great resource. The site is updated weekly with selected horror classics, which are then made available for free download as WMV files on the site's Snack Bar. The site is a fun little explosion from the past, with weekly screenings framed in a digital drive-in. Users can also purchase DVD copies of any movie on the website for just \$3. If you miss the old days on the internet when it was more like the Wild West and everything was less polished, this might be for you. The downside of so many different services available is that if you have a movie in mind but don't know where to watch it, you have many different directories to wade through in the hope of finding it. Fortunately, as long as you have a smartphone, you probably have access to a tool that You. Apple's TV app, available on iOS, as well as several other platforms including Apple TV, Roku, Amazon Fire TVs, plus LG and Samsung smart TVs, allows you to search across more than 50 different streaming services. For Android users, the Google Play Movies and TV app offers similar functionality, although the number of connected services is smaller. Roku devices now have a Featured Free section that offers a select selection of the best free content on the platform, whether you have a specific channel installed or not. This is in addition to the existing cross-service search, although most of what you find will either be available for purchase or rent or will be on a service that requires a subscription.
